Key activity highlights of 2023

- 27 separate media alerts
- 4 consumer surveys
- 5 major public awareness campaigns
- Daily media bulletin to 1,200 HCP subscribers
- Weekly newsletter to 5,200 HCP subscribers
- Updated vaccine-specific Guides for Healthcare Professionals (11 in total)
- Annual free public Influenza Vaccination Day (Brisbane, Sydney, Melbourne). Over 1,000 vaccines administered and attended by dignitaries and the media
- RACGP CPD Provider approval (January)
- 19 education events attracting over 5,000 delegates (mix of hybrid meetings, full-day programs, webinars and workshops; CPD and non-CPD)
- Updated PneumoSmart Tool aligned with Australian Immunisation Handbook
- 8 Industry medical presentations (various infectious disease areas) to the IC Scientific Advisory Committee
- Continued development of CoRiCal (Covid Vaccination Risk Calculator) for HCPs
- Fortnightly roundtable forum with industry, government, and vaccine providers to discuss vaccine-related issues
- Commenced a Point-of-Care-Testing program in GP Practice, aimed at reducing time between diagnosis and treatment
