





Emerging opportunities to provide care in community pharmacies in 2024

National Immunisation Program Vaccinations in Pharmacy (NIPVIP) Program



- Allows eligible patients to access free National Immunisation Program (NIP) vaccines in a community pharmacy, with no out-of-pocket costs¹
- Increases patient access and affordability of vaccinations for eligible Australians
- Funding mechanism (\$18.85) mitigates previous need to charge Professional Service Fee
- Eligibility:
 - aged 5 years and over at the time of vaccination and
 - eligible to receive the NIP vaccine in a pharmacy, and as per the NIP Schedule

Free influenza programs 2024

- Free flu programs drive significant increases in vaccination rates¹
- In line with NIP vaccine launch, all Queensland residents over the age of 6 months can access the influenza vaccine for free in 2024.
- Similar program to 2023
 expected in Western Australia in 2024, however, not yet

Travel Vaccination – a growing role for pharmacists

- Many patients do not know they require travel health advice and travel vaccination rates remain an opportunity^{2,3}
- A growing number of jurisdictions support pharmacists to provide opportunistic travel advice, assess, recommend and administer travel vaccinations and provide education and


