

NIP Vaccinations in Pharmacy (NIPVIP) Program

The NIPVIP Program commenced on 1 January 2024.

The Program provides funding to community pharmacies to administer NIP vaccines to eligible consumers with no out ofpocket costs.





NIPVIP Program Rules

The NIPVIP Program was limited to NIP vaccines administered:

- in a pharmacy setting
- to individuals aged 5 years and older
- for the vaccines, and age cohorts, permitted under state and territory legislation.


Expansion of NIPVIP to include Aged Care Homes and Disability Facilities

Indexation of fees to administer NIPVIP vaccines.






Number of influenza vaccines administered by community pharmacists (1 March to 2 June 2024)


Percentage of influenza vaccines administered by provider type (YTD)




State variation – Influenza vaccination 2024 (YTD)



Funding considerations and ordering government-funded vaccines

- Covid vaccination funding is available see: COVID-19 Vaccination in Community Pharmacy (CVCP) Program.
- Community pharmacies may be eligible to receive a payment for administering National Immunisation Program (NIP) Vaccines. For information about this program, see National Immunisation Program Vaccinations in Pharmacy (NIPVIP) Program.
- 3. Community pharmacies may be able to order free stock of NIP vaccines. Refer to Guidance for Pharmacist Immunisers
- Access to pharmacist approved NIP vaccines for information about ordering vaccines.
- State funded Hepatitis A vaccines are available for NSW residents who post exposure management.
- State funded Hepatitis B vaccines are available for some NSW residents including:
 - Aboriginal people
 - household and sexual contacts of acute and chronic hepatitis B cases
 - men who have sex with men
 - injecting drug users
 - sex workers
- 6. State funded MMR vaccines are available for NSW residents born during or after 1966 and rubella seronegative postnatal women.
- State funded Japanese encephalitis vaccines are available for NSW residents who meet the specified criteria.
